**Week 1 – 6/1-5 – Start of Summer Stay-cation** School's out for summer!!! All the hard work is done, and now it's time for a school-stay-cation! Come and have a blast at MSOW, because you earned it! We will play a variety of games, create fun crafts, make our own snacks, and lounge around, because that is what a stay-cation is all about!

**Week 2 – 6/8-12 – MSOW's Magical Meatless Monday Through Friday** Have you ever wondered what it means to be vegan? How does a vegan replace eggs? cheese? and why are regular marshmallows not vegan? We will find all of this out and much more, create and eat vegan snacks and investigate the positive environmental impact of using vs. not using animal products.

**Week 2 – 6/8-12 – Ice Age Trail – North** This class will be for those students who want an adventure. The Wisconsin IAT follows the terminal moraine, or furthest extent of the glaciers from the last ice age. The entire trail covers over 1,000 miles through 30 counties. This class will be the first of two related classes, the second one to be held July 20-24. Note: It is not required that a student attends both sessions.

The plan is to use maps, trail markers, compasses, and GPS receivers to hike the northern portion of the trail over the course of five days, rain or shine. We will cover hiking safety, handling emergencies, and basic navigation.

Each morning, we will be dropped off at the beginning of a trail section, then make our way to the pick up point, taking time to explore several of the various features along the way, geocaching, and resting when needed. Learning about glacial topography will be included. The next day we will start where we left off and get as far as we can, with the goal of covering about half of the 45.8 miles of IAT in the county (from the north county line in Monches to Lapham Peak). Due to the extent of this program, two or three afternoons will also be needed to allow time for ample breaks and exploration.

Due to the physical nature of this class, participating students should be able to walk moderate distances.

For an additional \$6 fee, interested students may also participate in the Ice Age Trail Alliance program called *Walk the Wauk*. In this program, hikers who complete all the segments of the IAT in Waukesha County will receive a completion certificate and IAT patch for their accomplishment. Please contact Mr. Bednarek for more information. As a note, Mr. Bednarek is a former EMT and holds Wilderness First Aid, CPR, and AED certifications.

**Week 3 – 6/15-19 – MSOW Olympic Games** The Olympics are 16 days of glory, which unite the world through the camaraderie of sports and competition. July 2020 will be the Games of the XXII Olympiad in Japan, but before that, MSOW will host its own version of the Olympics here in Waukesha! This week will promote sportsmanship, leadership, teamwork & most importantly having a blast! Fun & fellowship will headline this week! (Tennis shoes are a must this week!)

**Week 4 – 6/22-26 – Geometrocity** Come and build a city using math and geometry! Students will practice and apply learned skills in geometry while problem solving and making decisions based on their own knowledge, creativity, and imagination to build their very own city. Students will utilize many types of geometric concepts such as nets to create buildings and structures, designing parts of a city with shapes, lines, angles, and incorporating multiple skills at the same time to reach their objectives.

**Week 4 – 6/22-26 – First Aid Week** This class will explore a variety of first aid/medical topics to help students feel more confident when things go wrong. We will cover making emergency calls, sprains and strains, cleaning and dressing wounds, animal bites and stings, splinter removal, fractures, burns, and choking. We will also cover safety issues related to swimming, sun exposure, fire, electricity, natural gas, insect bite prevention, and avoidance of nuisance plants. Though not a certificate-based course, we will also cover the basics of CPR.

Since this will be a hands-on class, students should be willing to practice skills on others. If someone is unwilling to be a patient in our scenarios, they can just observe.

As a note, Mr. Bednarek is a former EMT and holds current Wilderness First Aid, CPR, and AED certifications.

**Week 5 – 7/6-10 – For the Love of Veggies (and Fruit too!)** Did you know that tomatoes are in the same family as potatoes? Do you know how banana trees or fig get pollinated and by what animal? Have you ever been to a farm and tried to identify plants and pollinators? This week we are going to learn all about fruit and vegetable families, try several kinds from each and learn to identify plants and pollinators.

**Week 5 – 7/6-10 – Science Week** If you like science, then this week is for you. We will spend our time exploring several different science areas through hands-on experiments and demonstrations. Anticipated topics include the scientific method, animal dissections, light, sound, motion/forces, states of matter, and energy.

Limit - 12 students (Entering grades 4-8)

**Week 6 – 7/13-17 – Midsummer Fun Week** It's back, once again! The most dynamic, outstanding, amazing & incredible week of the summer! Midsummer fun week is not just any week; it is 5 days of absolute fun! Activities will include numerous field trips, games, delicious food, art projects & a pinewood derby race to end the week! Come and be a part of an amazing time! **(Please note: This is a 9am-3pm theme week and space is limited to 16 students due to transportation limitations for off-site activities from MSOW campus.)**

**Week 7 – 7/20-24 – Building Bridges** Bridges are amazing structural wonders, but why are there so many different types of bridges? How is each type built? What happened to the Tacoma Narrows bridge (a.k.a. Gallopin' Gertie)? How do they build underwater foundations for bridges? We will learn much of this, and build our own bridges out of many different materials throughout the week.

**Week 7 – 7/20-24 – Ice Age Trail – South** This class will be for those students who want an adventure. The Wisconsin IAT follows the terminal moraine, or furthest extent of the glaciers from the last ice age. The entire trail covers over 1,000 miles through 30 counties. This class will be the second of the two Waukesha County IAT classes. Attending the first class is not required to attend this week.

The plan is to use maps, trail markers, compasses, and GPS receivers to hike the southern portion of the trail over the course of five days, rain or shine. We will cover hiking safety, handling emergencies, and basic navigation.

Each morning, we will be dropped off at the beginning of a trail section, then make our way to the pick up point, taking time to explore several of the various features along the way, geocaching, and resting when needed. Learning about glacial topography will be included. The next day we will start where we left off and get as far as we can, with the goal of covering about half of the 45.8 miles of IAT in the county (from Lapham Peak to the county line west of Eagle). Due to the extent of this program, two or three afternoons will also be needed to allow for ample breaks and exploration.

Due to the physical nature of this class, participating students should be able to walk moderate distances.

**Week 8 – 7/27-31 – President for a Week** Have you ever wondered what it would be like to be president? In this class, students will take on the role as president of their country and must complete a variety of activities and projects that presidents face on a daily basis. This project combines writing, research, collaboration, social studies, current events, and provides unlimited opportunities for students to show their own prior knowledge!

**Week 9 – 8/3-7 – Wondrous Waukesha** Waukesha is full of history and interesting sites. This week we will walk to downtown Waukesha each day to find Les Paul guitars, a Native American mound, buildings made with Cream City brick, an old site of the "Waukesha healing waters", and much more. Come and learn why Waukesha is such a wonderful place to be!

**Week 9 – 8/3-7 – Bike Week** This class is for those who want to spend a week on two wheels. Though the schedule for this class might vary due to weather, the goal is to work on bike handling and safety skills, cover basic maintenance, and then ride as much as possible.

Due to the location of several connecting trails, the class will be held at Lapham Peak State Park and will require participants to be dropped off and picked up there. Families can carpool or coordinate with others for transportation. Mr. Bednarek will be able to transport two or three bikes if needed as well. If your child will be in aftercare, we can work to coordinate transportation.

On one day, we will plan to ride the Glacial Drumlin Trail to Hwy 83 (of course stopping at LeDuc's for custard). We will get a chance to ride to Cushing Park in Delafield as well. We will also use the mountain bike trails to get the students more comfortable riding on uneven surfaces. The trails there are fairly basic with no real technical areas. Proficient riders can take on more challenges as appropriate.

Since we will ride on both paved and grassy areas, students should have a bike in good working order, preferably with at least one shock and at least somewhat knobby tires. Full suspension or fat bikes are not required. Hybrid or mountain bikes tend to work best. Helmets are required. As a note, Mr. Bednarek is a former EMT and holds Wilderness First Aid, CPR, and AED certifications.

Limit 12 students (Entering grades 5-8 or entering grade 4 if already confident with themselves and their bike. Ability to follow instructions is a must for this class.)

**Week 10 – 8/10-14 – All things Pi** When the moon hits your eye like a big pizza pie, that's amore!' Whether it is by the slice or calculated as the number 3.14159, this week is all about celebrating all things pie and Pi. We will make and eat pizza pie, as well as learn how to make different types of pies and crusts. We will also learn about, calculate & commemorate the number Pi while we eat our pies!

**Week 11 – 8/17-21 – End of Summer Extravaganza** It's the end of the summer. Pretty soon school will be in session, and learning will be the primary objective, BUT before that, let's have a week of fun! End of Summer Extravaganza is THE way to wrap up "A Summer of Fun"! Let's kick-start our brains and get them ready for the next school year. Activities will include plenty of games, jigsaw puzzles, word searches, crossword puzzles, trivia & quizzes. This is going to be a fun week to end the summer, and get
